Goals

The European project MISUP - Strengthening Migrant Support Communities, co-funded by the European Union's Erasmus+ program, is making steady progress. After several months of collaborative work between partners from Spain, the Netherlands, Greece, Italy, and Lithuania, we have successfully completed the research phase, focused on identifying the main organizational needs of organizations that work with migrants (MSOs).

MINTIES BITĖS: One of the main challenges faced by Minties Bitės is the limited organizational capacity to address the complex needs of migrants, particularly those from conflict-affected regions like Ukraine and Belarus. The organization struggles with insufficient resources and a lack of structured training for staff, which hampers their ability to offer consistent support in areas such as legal aid, employment integration, and psychosocial assistance.

Stichting Al Amal: Coralie Sarolea highlights the critical challenge of navigating fragmented support systems for migrants, particularly asylum seekers and undocumented individuals. The lack of coordination between governmental and grassroots services often results in duplicated efforts and unmet needs, leaving vulnerable migrants without reliable access to legal guidance, healthcare, or housing. This fragmentation severely limits their ability to integrate and assert their rights within host communities.
